The REACT course is a **five-week training programme** on conflict prevention and peacebuilding intended for professionals interested in being deployed in **peace operations** and contribute to the global efforts to build international **peace and security.**

Diploma: Participants who successfully complete the course will obtain a diploma from the *International University Centre for Peace Missions* of Helsinki España, and the *Escuela de Organización Industrial*

Objectives:

- -To provide participants with the knowledge and skills necessary to understand and analyze the main threats to international peace and security, the contexts in which armed conflicts arise, their key actors and the impact of conflict on civilians.
- -To build participants' capabilities in prevention, management and resolution of conflicts as well as protection of civilians in armed conflicts.
- -To strengthen the capacity and confidence of participants to deal effectively with risk-associated and emergency/critical situations while deployed in hostile environments abroad







Methodology: The course uses a variety of methodologies, including lectures and presentations, debates, group work, practical and advanced role-playing sessions, outdoor activities and simulation exercises.

Faculty: The teaching staff are trainers and experts from international organizations (including the UN, EU, OSCE and NATO), diplomats and civil servants, military personnel, police officers, experts from the ICRC and humanitarian NGOs, independent consultants, and university professors.

Candidates who wish to be considered for a partial scholarship should enclose proof of their annual income and employment status. Documents should be officially translated into English or Spanish.

- -Two letters of recommendation on letterheaded paper. They should include the date and stamp/signature of the entity/person that is writing the letter. The ORIGINALS MUST be sent by post. Letters may be advanced via email, however, originals are still required.
- -English language certificate. If you don't have one, contact us and we will schedule a brief phone interview.
- -In case you apply for a partial scholarship, **proof of your** annual income together with an official translation into English or Spanish. This is absolutely mandatory.

Applications will be evaluated according to order of arrival until all available places are filled. Early applications are encouraged.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

PAYMENTS:

Payment of tuition fees can be made in full or through an installment payment plan, which enables participants to divide the cost of course into two installments.

Payments should be made by bank transfer to Helsinki España.

REFUND POLICY:

If a participant cancels his/her participation prior to the start date of the course due to visa or health related reasons, payments made will be deferred to the following course free of charge.

VISA:

It is the participant's responsibility to make all the appropriate visa arrangements before traveling to Spain. At least 2 months should be allowed for visa processing.

Helsinki España will provide all the necessary documents to support visa applications. However, participants are required to pay the $\mbox{\ensuremath{\mathfrak{e}}}$ 350 registration fee prior to the issuance of the letter of invitation.

TRAVEL AND ACCOMMODATION:

Participants should arrive before the opening and depart after the official closure of the course.

Participants are responsible for their own travel and accommodation arrangements. Helsinki España will not be held accountable for any arrangements or travel /accommodation related costs in Madrid.

Helsinki España will arrange accommodation and transportation to all field visits at no additional cost. Students will be lodged in double rooms. No meals are included in the course fees.
